## CPS SYSTEM INVADES MATH CLASSES

Mr. DeBoard, mathematics instructor at WHS, has recently acquired a CPS system. CPS includes a response pad for the student (like a remote control) and a receiver at the teacher's desk. With this powerful system you can ask multiple choice and numeric questions in classes of up to 1,000 students. Each response pad has an LCD screen that allows students to view questions and the answers they have entered, then instantly sends the information to the teacher's computer.
